Man Gets 17 Years for Aggravated Robbery

Bryan, TX – On Monday, March 31, 2014, Quillian Davenport pled guilty and received 17 years in prison for his role in an Aggravated Robbery that occurred on November 30, 2012.

Davenport robbed a man walking home from a local convenience store by threatening the victim with a handgun. He got the man's wallet and ran. Based on the victim's description of the robber, police contacted Davenport a couple of blocks away from the scene of the robbery.

When the police began to pat Davenport down, he took off running. He was caught after a short foot chase, and police discovered a fully loaded .22 revolver he discarded during the chase. The revolver also matched the description the victim gave.

Davenport will have to serve at least half of his sentence before becoming eligible for parole.
