Man Given Maximum Sentence for Violating Probation

Bryan, TX – Pedro Rodriguez, Jr., 34, was sentenced to 10 years in prison today for repeatedly violating his conditions of probation. Rodriguez was placed on probation in September 2010 after he pled guilty to Robbery.

In January 2011, Rodriguez was ordered to participate in the Substance Abuse Felony Punishment Facility (SAFPF), an inpatient treatment facility, for his use of cocaine.

Following his re-

lease from SAFP, Rodriguez repeatedly refused to report to the probation department and instead moved to Brownwood, Texas without permission.

The State also presented evidence that while on probation, Rodriguez continued to use cocaine, failed to attend mandatory substance abuse treatment, failed to complete any of his court-ordered community service hours, and was delinquent in paying his supervision fees.

After hearing this evidence, Judge Travis Bryan revoked Rodriguez's probation and sentenced him to the maximum of 10 years in prison.

The case was prosecuted by Assistant District Attorney Will Ward.
