## Man Gets 10 Years in Prison for Burglary

Bryan, TX – Labrison Young was sentenced to 10 years in prison after a jury convicted him of Burglary of a Habitation.

The jury found Young guilty after hearing evidence that on August 20, 2013, he broke into his ex-girlfriend's apartment, vandalized the place, and subsequently set it on fire.

The defendant's ex-girlfriend testified that she was on her way to her apartment when Young called and told her she was in for a "rude awakening" when she got home. Later, as she was watching the Bryan Fire Department extinguish the fire, Young

called his ex-girlfriend and told her he did it because he had seen her with another man.

The investigation revealed that Young used gasoline to ignite his ex-girlfriend's bed and burn her bedroom. The damage from smoke and fire reached neighboring apartments, and one neighbor had to be evacuated before the fire reached her apartment. Firefighters also rescued a dog from the apartment directly above the apartment Young set on fire.

Assistant District Attorneys John Brick & Jason Goss prosecuted the case on behalf of the State of Texas.
